Historical shrines and temples



Gokokuji Temple



Gokokuji Temple is a scenic cultural spot. The seventeenth century temple is surrounded with lush green trees which turn pink in spring and yellow in autumn. A spot to relax and rejuvenate, along with traditional Japanese atmosphere and spirituality.

Yushima Tenmangu Shrine



Yushima Tenmangu Shrine is devoted to Sugawara no Michizane, a famous scholar and politician from the Heian Period. He is called the god of learning after his demise. Many students come to this shrine to pray for success in exam. During exam season, the shrine is quite crowded.

Nezu Jinja Shrine



Famed for its azaleas, Nezu Jinja Shrine ranks among the oldest in Japan. The ornate Main Hall stands in sharp contrast to the characteristic simplicity of Shinto shrines. A path of senbon-torii gates and a pond complete with lazily swimming koi fish lends an extra touch of serenity to the scene.

• Koishikawa Korakuen Gardens •

The Garden was built in the Edo period and is a very historic place with the Chinese styled stone bridge and the red bridge. • Amezaiku Yoshihara •

The candy lining the walls of Amezaiku Yoshihara looks more like delicate glass sculptures than candy. Choose between a premade flower, animal, or mystical creature, and requesting a design and enjoying the craftsman's enchanting performance as they sculpt it in front of you.



• Origami Kaikan •



The "Origami Kaikan" was established in 1858, as a Washi paper manufacturing center owned by the Kobayashi family. The old establishment was renovated to its current stage in 1972 to promote origami. Now, origami related activities can be enjoyed at this facility, admission is free.

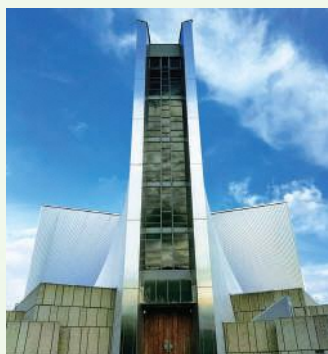
• Tokyo Dome City Attractions •

• St. Mary's Cathedral •

A remarkable piece of architecture built in the shape of a cross with eight hyperbolic parabolas opening upwards to form a cross of light. The large and quiet atmosphere inside gives a sense of internal reflection and introspection. The Cathedral is the seat of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Tokyo.
