### 4 Kodokan Judo Museum & Library [D-3]

**Valuable exhibits from the beginning of Judo**  
The museum exhibits photographs and materials that make visitors familiar with the development of Kodokan Judo, including the worn-out judo-gi that Master Jigoro KANO, the founder of Judo, wore, and hanging scrolls of calligraphy that say, “Seiryoku Zenyo” (maximum efficient use of energy) and “Jita Kyoei” (mutual prosperity for self and others). See a judo-gi worn by Shiro SAIGO, said to be the model for the title character of the novel, “Sugata Sanshiro,” Akira KUROSAWA made a film based on it. The library boasts a large collection of Judo-related books and DVDs.

### 6 Yushima Seido (the Mausoleum of Confucius at Yushima) [E-3]

**Shoheizaka Academic Center - Birthplace of Modern Education**  
The fifth Tokugawa shogun, Tsunoyoshi, constructed this Confucian temple in 1690, and a state-run school, Shoheizaka Academic Center or Shoheizoku, was established here in 1797. In the Edo-era, the former was respected as the head temple of academics and education. The current temple was rebuilt to a design by Dr. Ito Chuta in 1935 after it burned down in the 1923 Great Kanto Earthquake.

### 7 Museum of Health and Medicine, The University of Tokyo [E-2]

**Introducing the latest medical science and health care**  
Our Museum was planned as part of commemorative projects to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the founding of the School of Medicine, the University of Tokyo and the University of Tokyo Hospital. It was opened in January, 2011, and was moved in April, 2019. We have three exhibition areas. The permanent exhibition is a display of the achievements and history, while other exhibitions are introductions of the advances in the medical science and medical care.

With a collection of four million academic specimens, the main building features the concept of “displaying research sites” in order to provide visitors with a view of the real work carried out by the museum. Its storehouse and laboratories are partially glass walled, in addition to displays of real stuffed animals and skeletons.

### 9 Koishikawa Annex, The University Museum, The University of Tokyo [C-2]

**A university museum housed in a building registered as Important Cultural Property of Japan**  
The museum is situated within the oldest remaining school building of the University of Tokyo which was constructed in 1876 as the main building of its predecessor, Tokyo Medical School. It is designated as Important Cultural Property of Japan. Now it is open to the public as an architectural museum whose permanent exhibition is entitled “ARCHITECTONICA”. Items on display include architectural materials mainly focusing on architectural models and ethnographic collections.

This museum introduces the history of Tokyo's waterworks from the Edo-era Kanda and Tamagawa aqueducts right to today's waterworks. With audio guides and an AR guide tool that allows you to experience the rowhouse area (only in Japanese), as well as a library that displays works related to waterworks and the history of Edo-Tokyo, everyone both young and old can enjoy learning here.

Toyo Women's Dental College symbolized higher education for women during the Taisho Era. After becoming a college of science during the post World War II occupation period, it flourished and became Toyo Women's College (Department of English). The Archives display historical sources covering the past hundred years.

### 12 Inoue Enryō Memorial Museum, Toyo University [D-2]

**Follow the life of the philosophical evangelist**  
Toyo University began when Inoue Enryō founded a private school called the Philosophy Academy in 1887. This museum houses a permanent exhibition of the philosopher's works that represent the era of modern Japan. It includes his handwritten notes, manuscripts, favorite items and collected goods, etc. We introduce his life, dedicated to the dissemination of philosophy.

### 13 Toyo Bunko Museum [D-1]

**Get a commemorative photo taken in front of the Morrison's Stacks and its 24,000 books!**  
Founded in 1924 by Iwasaki Hisaya, the third president of Mitsubishi, this is the largest and oldest research library of Asia in Japan. The museum holds approximately a million volumes, including five National Treasures and seven Important Cultural Properties of Japan. These books can be seen at the museum and library reading room. Toyo Bunko also has a restaurant, “Orient Cafe”

### 14 Nippon Medical School Saisei Gakusha Gallery [D-2]

**History of Nippon Medical School, and its predecessor Saisei Gakusha**  
Saisei Gakusha, the predecessor of Nippon Medical School, was established in 1876 (the 9th year of the Meiji period), a few years after the Meiji Restoration, with the purpose of rapid training of doctors. The school produced many medical professionals and medical researchers. The Saisei Gakusha Gallery exhibits some historical materials related to graduates, including Chuta Oguchi and Hideyo Noguchi.

The Memorial Hall was built in commemoration of Jizuro Naruse, the founder of Japan Women's University. The museum exhibits not only the history of the school but also a planned exhibition presenting graduates working in fields such as art and design. The campus features the Naruse Memorial Auditorium and the former Jizuro Naruse Residence, designated by Bunkyo City as tangible cultural property.

**Archive in pursuit of peace and against wars**  
Why have we been unable to do away with war in our world? What did the war dead think about whilst in the battle field? The writings left behind by student soldiers along with war records and materials from the Asia-Pacific War will force us to confront these questions. The Museum Watsuminoko has accumulated the personal and public materials, including letters and diaries, of these victims of war, and opens them up to visitors. Watsuminoko translates as “the voices from the deep.”

The museum stands quietly in the corner of Mejiro-dai, among the remains of Musashino fields. The museum exhibits different themes such as paintings and writings (calligraphy), ceramics, armor, and weapons from the Hosokawa family, which dates back to the Nanbokucho period and who prospered as the daimyo (feudal lord) of the Higo Kumamoto clan.

A permanent exhibition includes works by Kasho Takabakata, a Japanese painter who swept the nation in the late Taisho and early Showa eras. It shares an entrance with the adjoining Takehisa Yumeji Museum.

### 29 Kyu-Iwasaki-tei Gardens [E-2]

**Gardens reminiscent of the olden days**  
The mansion was built in 1896 as the main residence of Hisaya Iwasaki, third president of the Mitsubishi Corporation. It incorporates the three buildings from the original, the Western-style building, billiard room, and the Japanese-style great hall. The Western-style building and billiard room were designed by British architect Josiah Conder. The Japanese-style great hall is said to have been built by master carpenter Kijuro Kumano. The entire site is designated as an important cultural property of the country.

 Take a look at the monument of the former residence of Soseki Natsume with a title written by Yasuni Kawabata, which is located on the premises.

**16** Insect Museum of J.H.Fabre  
 You can see insects super magnified with a unique tool "Mushi Mega Ne-Kun".

**18** Mori Ogai Memorial Museum  
 Trace the history of Mori Ogai's life at the permanent exhibition, and learn about all the things Ogai did through special exhibitions held four times a year!

**24** Sentaro Iwata Collection Kindonichikan Museum  
 This museum preserves almost 800 works of Sentaro, the last successor of Edo Ukiyo-e Bijin-ga.

**25** Takehisa Yumeji Museum  
 This museum has a collection of 3,300 works of Yumeji Takehisa, with themed exhibitions held three or four times a year.

**28** Yayoi Museum  
 This museum exhibits the artworks of Kashi Takabatake who succeeded as an illustrator in the early Showa period. In addition, the unique temporary exhibitions are very popular.

**30** The Former Kusuo Yasuda Residence and Gardens  
 You can enjoy Japanese gardens and over one-hundred-year-old Japanese architecture.
